

## Dog Park Rules

- This is an unsupervised, use at your own risk facility. Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries or damages caused by them.
- Children are strongly discouraged from entering the dog park.
- Minors under 13 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult.
- Children's toys are not allowed.
- Dogs showing aggression towards people, other animals or causing a disturbance must be removed immediately.
- Owners must:
  - Clean up after their dog(s). Refer to Town Code 92.07
  - Keep their dog(s) within sight and under voice control at all times.
  - Prevent their dog(s) from digging and fill any holes created by their dog(s).
  - Have one (1) leash per dog near hand at all times.
- Dogs must be leashed before entering and upon leaving the fenced-in area.
- No more than two (2) dogs per person.
- Puppies must be at least four (4) months old.
- All dogs must wear a current rabies and vaccinations tag.
- Choke or prong collars are not allowed.
- Female dogs in season/heat are not permitted in the park.
- Food/treats both human and animal are not allowed.
- No glass containers or alcohol of any kind are allowed in the park.
- Park hours are 7:00 a.m.—9:00 p.m.

## Tips & Etiquette

### Children & Dogs

- Teach children how to behave around dogs before bringing them to the park.
- Not all dogs are child friendly or accustomed to being around children. Children are easily run over or knocked down by running dogs.
- Dogs may nip at children in an attempt to herd them.
- Children who run and scream may become a target for the dogs.
- Never allow children to approach or pet a dog without the owner's presence and consent.

## Etiquette

- Please remember that the park was created solely for dog owners to allow their dogs to run freely off leash.
- Check the entrance before unleashing your dog to ensure that the park gate is closed securely.
- Should it become necessary to leash your dog due to a behavior problem, please exit the park promptly.
- Smoking is not allowed in the park.



- Be prepared to share your dog's toys if you choose to bring them to the park.

- Canine and human park users are expected to behave with common courtesy and respect for the property as well as other park users.

## Town Code 92.07

### SANITATION PROCEDURES.

(A) No owner or custodian of any animal shall cause or allow an animal to soil, defile or defecate on any public property or upon any street, sidewalk, public way, play area or common grounds owned jointly by the members of a homeowners or condominium association, or upon private property other than that of the owner, unless the owner or custodian immediately removes and disposes of all feces deposited by an animal by the following methods:

(1) Collection of the feces by appropriate implement and placement in a paper or plastic bag or container;

(2) Removal of the bag or container to the property of the animal owner or custodian or disposition in garbage bins, not storm drains or drainage ditches or any other public or private property except private property owned by the owner or custodian; and

(3) The owner or agent walking his or her dog or other animal outside of his or her private property must have in his or her

possession a pooper scooper, plastic bag or similar device to pick up the dog's excrement if deposited while on the walk.

(B) No person owning, harboring or keeping an animal within the town shall permit any waste matter from the animal to collect or remain on the property of the owner or custodian, or on the property of others so as to cause or create an unhealthy, unsanitary, dangerous or offensive living condition on the owner's or custodian's property, or to abutting property of others.

(C) No person owning, harboring, keeping or in charge of any animal shall cause unsanitary dangerous or offensive conditions by virtue of the size or number of animals maintained at a single location or due to the inadequacy of the facilities.
